# Meridian to Memphis

I grew up in Memphis which is just above the north west corner of Mississippi. I have a son in Meridian, Mississippi which is central-east Mississippi.

When Sue Anne and I go to Memphis

for funerals or for family events we now go through Meridian so that we can see

our son. Once we leave Meridian, heading for Memphis (our destination), we have to go west and north. The reason I am telling you this is because the Lord gave me a picture in order to teach me an important reality.

Scripture talks about having Jesus as Savior and Lord. Savior and Lord are no more the same than east and west is from north and south. Jesus as Savior means that He is

an expert in setting wrongs to right and rescuing people from problems that are of their own making as well as accidental. He saves those drowning in life just as a life guard saves a drowning victim in a pool or at the beach. The life guard does not discriminate between crisis or stupidity, the lifeguard simply saves those who are perishing.

I recently read a joke that said the only way to ban prayer from schools is to ban tests. When we are about to take a test, when a loved one is critically ill, when money problems overwhelm then these are the times when we are quick to jump


on the Savior band wagon—the Lord band wagon, however, is a different mat-

The problem with American Christianity is that many people want the Savior without the Lord. Jesus as Lord means that His ways becomes our ways—His thoughts, our thoughts. Jesus as Lord means that He has our permission to call each and every shot in life whether we like it or not. Most people want to be rescued, but only a much smaller group are willing to abdicate control of life to the

> Lord. It takes a committed person to pray as Jesus did in Gethsemane, "Take this cup from Me, but not My will but Thy will be done." The prayer begins with Jesus crying out to the Father to save Him the Savior side of God. The prayer ends, however, with Jesus trusting in the Father's lordship over the situation— "not My will but Thy will be ≥ done."

Memphis. Having Jesus as *Savior* is like traveling east and west on the interstate of life, while trusting in Jesus as *Lord* is comparable to journeying north and south. If you take the Interstate to Memphis from Meridian you first travel west to Jackson (Savior), but if you do not then turn north (Lord) you will not reach your desired destination. If you keep going west you will pass through Vicksburg, Monroe, Shreveport and eventually Dallas. Those are great cities that look like Memphis (sort of), but they are not your destination. Unless a person adds Lord-

ship to Savior they will end in life that sort of looks like their destiny but is actually not their destiny. Destiny and destination have the



same root.
Your destination
holds your
destiny.

For a person to find and fulfill their destiny they need Jesus as both *Savior* and *Lord*. Without both we exist in just an east/west existence. This is why Scripture, the Prayer Book, the Baptismal Service all use the language of "our *Lord* and *Savior*, Jesus Christ."

When Jesus is *Lord*, His will becomes my will, His desires, my desires. Over and over again, Scripture reveals God's will about various situations and how to safely navigate in a broken, fallen world.

When most people die, they leave a will. The law does not allow much creativity when executing a will. You go by what is written. The same is true with God and His will.

It is very important to understand that Jesus saves. This is a one time action as well as an ongoing operation. This is not just about getting us into heaven but about getting heaven into us. It is the understanding that no matter how bad the mess, He is willing to do what He does best-save. This understanding takes us from Meridian to Jackson. Once in Jackson, however, it takes a north/south action to reach our ultimate destination and the fulfillment of our purpose for being our destiny. We take the understanding of Savior and combine it with the reality of Lord and we eventually reach Memphis.

Where are you on this journey? Have you overshot the east/west turn? Is it time to turn north or south? It takes both to get where we are going. Blessings, Scott +
